Basic Payment Scheme - Greening update

Revised and updated rules for Greening 2016 were published on 29th September. Key changes from 2015 are;

- Oil radish can now be used as part of a mix for catch/cover crops planted in 2016. This is a great relief as oil radish is a key constituent in many green cover mixes.
- Some Ecological Focus Area (EFA) features can now be up to 5 metres away from arable land, rather than immediately next to it.

Again it will be necessary for farmers to undertake their greening calculations to ensure they comply with the scheme requirements. Please contact us if you need clarification or guidance on Greening (EFAs & crop diversification rules) for the autumn drilling period. The full BPS rules and guidance will be published in February 2016 and will explain which farmers can apply for the Basic Payment Scheme in 2016 and what all the rules of the scheme are.

Countryside Stewardship Scheme (CSS)

The application window for Mid Tier applications has just closed for the 1st January 2016 agreement start date. Our experience to date is that the eligibility requirement for pure grassland farms is particularly challenging, but the bonus is the availability of boundary capital grant funding. Meeting the eligibility requirements for arable and mixed farms is far easier to achieve.

During 2016 the scheme will operate on a 3 tier basis; Higher Tier (broadly similar to HLS), Mid Tier (broadly similar to ELS) and a Capital and Planning Grants Tier. Key dates in 2016 are thought to be similar to 2015 for expiring ELS or HLS agreement holders, or those considering CSS for the first time. At present, these

February 2016 (tbc) for stand alone capital grants. There is a £5k maximum limit for this.

- 15th July for Expressions of Interest submission. **Higher Tier only.**
- 30th September; deadline for Mid Tier & Higher Tier applications.

The scheme will be competitive at all levels, with all applications scored and ranked on a national basis. The majority of agreements will run for 5 years, with the applications judged against regional targeting statements. Payment rates are good for arable options in particular, eg. Winter bird food £640/ha and flower rich margins and plots £539 / ha.

Cross compliance breaches

National figures for 2014 non compliances are not yet publically available from the RPA. Local experience has suggested that the following Cross Compliance rules are most likely to cause issues in the event of an inspection;

- GAEC 1; buffer strips along watercourses. The most common noncompliance here is 'mission creep' of cultivations and sprays onto the buffer strips. In addition, the new requirement to produce and keep a map of the holding showing: all surface waters, springs, wells and boreholes and land within 10 metres of them.
- **GAECs 4, 5 & 6**; soils. The most likely non-compliances here are if erosion is found to be over a single area greater than 1ha, or caused by livestock trampling along a continuous length of 20m x 2m along a watercourse.
- **SMR 1**; NVZs. The most common non compliances surround record keeping and manures storage & spreading.
- **SMR 7**; Cattle identification and registration. Lost tags and movement details.

Updated 2016 Cross Compliance guidance is due in late November but no major changes are expected from the 2015 rules. Our Cross Compliance Service will help you to comply with all of the requirements including your NVZ records; contact us for further information.
